She is the happiest in her job when she "hears a shift and something clicks for a participant, and when they talk about how stopping their abuse and engaging in safe relationships has led to more fulfilling relationships with their partners and children."

The biggest challenge, Betty said, is recruiting and retaining highly skilled staff. It's only recently the public has recognized partner abuse intervention services' crucial role in intervening in and preventing domestic violence. Despite funding challenges, she said the Center has developed a staff with dedication and expertise in this important work.
